Appraising 3: The Voice

ROOM 6 Students will demonstrate and continue to develop their music appraising and deliberate listening skills to prepare and present a Presentation on a chosen Pop Song. Their presentation will be structured through deliberate listening tasks to develop students' understanding and appraising of the musical elements. Students then get to extend their learning into a practical project based on their chosen song, further developing their use of music technology and musical imagination.
