Create revision cards for poetic techniques – terminology/use/generic purpose or effect

Create revision cards for modern novel/C19th novel/Shakespeare play

- Characters: role, key quotations, characteristic use of language, dramatic function
- Structure
- Setting
- Themes
- Key techniques used and effects
- Contextual information

Read online essays and make notes. Use a 'thinking hard' strategy. Reduce notes by half. Repeat until you can summarise in one sentence.

Teach someone else the key concept/material.

Create a plan/write essay focussing on any character/theme in the text.

Create revision cards for each Language question

- Timing
- Marks available
- Criteria

Create revision cards for each type of Q5 – Narrative/Description/Article

- Purpose
- Text type
- Techniques

Create revision cards for each technique writers use

Read widely – information texts, narratives, descriptions, argument pieces, blogs.

Read the same article in different places – ie The Sun and The Guardian.
