Wear our uniform with pride

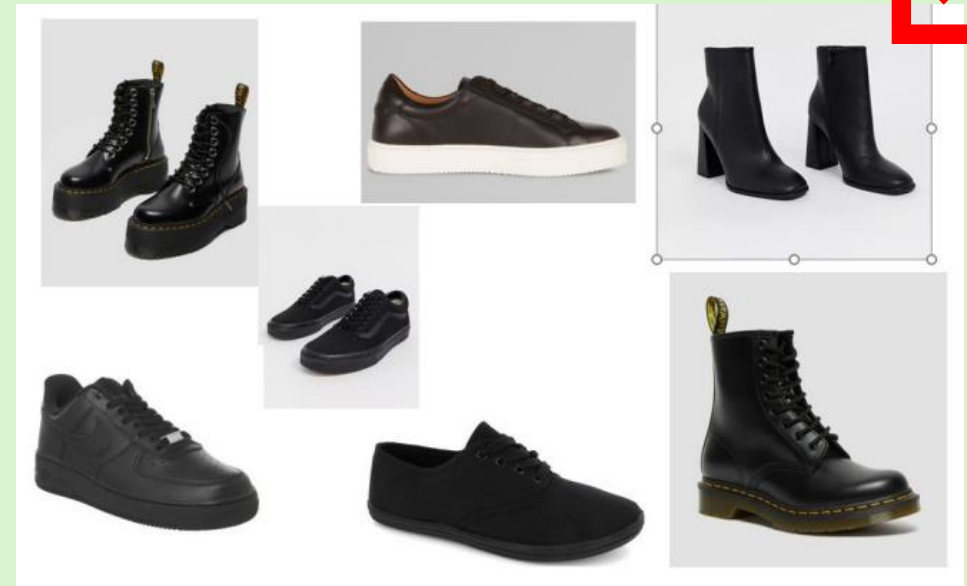
Here are some key reminders:

- School trousers/skirt not leggings.
- Hoodies are not permitted on site.
- Black school shoes, not trainers.
- Black socks.
- Shirts tucked in.
- Wear your house tie with pride.
- School branded jumpers only.
- No excessive jewelry.

Do not be surprised if you are escorted to the uniform hub if you arrive to school not meeting these expectations

Teachers will be checking your uniform as part of their entry routines. If you are in the wrong uniform and you do not have a note from the uniform hub, you will be asked to correct your uniform or borrow clean items from the hub or risk being sent to refocus.

If parents have difficulty in sourcing any of our approved uniform, please contact your child's tutor and we will support where possible.



At Monkton Wood we...



are mobile-phone free

- We are a mobile phone **free** site for students.
- Phones must be **off or on aeroplane mode**, in the bottom of school bags, whilst students are on site.
- If seen, a phone will be **confiscated**. It can be collected from student reception at the end of the day.
- If a student **refuses** to hand in their phone, we will contact parents to come to collect it and take it away.
- We will use our learning ready behaviour policy for students not meeting these expectations – Warnings and Refocus if necessary

We would ask that parents support us in this by refraining from contacting students on their phones during the school day. All emergencies and urgent messages can be directed and delivered through the school reception.

At Monkton Wood we...



Where students fall short of our standards, they will be given opportunities to make better choices

1st Warning

Your teacher will inform you of the reason for your warning, and write your name on the board.
Your teacher will remind you of the expectations and the learning mode.
You should change your behaviour so that you are not moved or referred.
You should be ready to have a short conversation with your teacher at the end of the lesson.
Your teacher will log the negative in Class Charts.

2nd Warning

Your teacher will give a second warning and write a 2 next to your name on the board.
Your teacher may ask you to move seats.
You should move seats, without argument or making a scene.
You should change your behaviour so that you are not referred to the re-focus room.
Your teacher will log the negative in Class Charts.

Refocus Referral

Your teacher will ask you to go to the re-focus room.
Your teacher will log the referral in Class Charts.
Your teacher will call your parent/carer the same day, to explain the reason for your referral.
You should make your way to the refocus room quickly and with no fuss.
